
Camacho Triple Maduro Gordo

TASTE: Earthy, Cedar, Cocoa HOBBIES: Family time, Grilling, Combat Sports STRENGTH: Medium / Full



The Camacho Triple Maduro is a dark, rich, and full flavored cigar. Camacho blended a San Andres wrapper, a Corojo maduro binder, and finished it off with Honduran, Dominican and Brazilian fillers. During the first third, I noticed pronounced woody flavors with subtle chocolate notes but exceptionally smooth. The second third was just as smooth as the first with the notes of chocolate being a little more pronounced and that beautiful Camacho spice picking up. The final third was amazing. For such a strong smoke, the flavors stayed present all the way. It did not get boring and the thick clouds of smoke left a creamy aftertaste to balance out the spice. I picked up notes of leather at different points throughout. Since this stick is made by Davidoff, you already know the construction was perfect and with a great draw. I highly recommend this cigar to anyone looking for a strong, smooth cigar with just as much flavor and complexity.

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
Macanudo Inspirado Red Gigante

The Macanudo Inspirado Red Gigante immediately exhibits several flavors, none of which could be called dominant at any point: espresso beans, dark chocolate, cinnamon, spices, oak, and leather. The red pepper on the retro hale is the strongest of the flavors. It supersedes the others without overwhelming them. The second third features the same red pepper on the retro hale. It might even be a bit more aggressive while the flavors in the profile are a close copy of the first third, including cinnamon, dark chocolate, baker's spices, oak, and freshly roasted coffee beans. The berry sweetness from the first third remains about the same. In the final third, the berry sweetness increases to become a more significant part of the profile joining the other notes of oak, dark cocoa nibs, bitter espresso beans, earth, hay, and creamy nuts. The red pepper on the retro hale is as aggressive as ever, keeping track with the other flavors.

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
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Kristoff Maduro Robusto





TASTE: Wood, Earth, Leather HOBBIES: Guitar, Beer, Sarcasm STRENGTH: Medium / Full



One of the most overlooked maduros on the market is the Kristoff Maduro. First thing's first, this is a great looking cigar with a simple brown band adorning a super oily Brazilian maduro wrapper. A pigtail crowns the head of this stick, and a shaggy foot lets you know you're in for a tasty treat. When lit, the smoke output was generous, and the aroma of sweet molasses filled the room. I detected notes of chocolate not long into the session, with a subtle yet savory touch of spice on the finish thanks to the Nicaraguan filler included alongside the otherwise Dominican-dominant blend. Leathery notes made their way into the fray from time to time, and the ash was flaky yet under control. I decided to skip the cutter and twisted off the pigtail, which gave me a more than acceptable draw. Burn was slow and straight, and I love the aroma this thing gives off! Full-bodied but smooth, this is a great choice for relaxing after dinner.

PAIRING SUGGESTION: Stout Beer, Scotch, Bourbon



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
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Aging Room Quattro Sonata Maestro





TASTE: All **HOBBIES: Working out!!** STRENGTH: Medium / Full



Ever since the Aging Room Quattro Sumatra Sonata came out, it has been catching my attention with its bright colors. Cold Draw shows signs of coffee and lots of spices. At first light, this cigar tells you right away that it's going to be spicy. Earthiness and spice are the strongest notes on the retro-hale, but an exquisite mix of nuttiness, cream, earthiness, and tons of spice are packed into this cigar. The second and final third showed a strong emergence of coffee notes, which paired wonderfully with the spice and creaminess. Draw is great, with only a couple retouches needed on the burn. Aroma was fantastic, which is what I expected from this fabulous line. The smoke output was fantastic, way better than I expected. This cigar is nice, medium bodied with full flavor, but you definitely need to like spicy cigars if you intend to pick this one up! I would pair this with a nice scotch to sit back and enjoy after a nice dinner!

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
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Rocky Patel The Edge Maduro Toro





TASTE: All HOBBIES: MMA, Music, Photography, Videography STRENGTH: Medium / Full



Upon lighting up I'm greeted by a mix of dried cedar and maduro sweetness with a hint of pepper. The draw is excellent, and the cigar is pouring out a ton of dense smoke. The cigar hits the medium-full mark right out of the gate. About 40 minutes in I'm in the second third, and I've been hit with slight notes of coffee. The spice is still a prevalent flavor. The smoke is still very dense, and the burn is perfect. This cigar is categorized as medium, but I would put it as a full body cigar. At about 1 hour and 20-minute point I'm at the final third. Spice, espresso, and leather have taken off the flavor profile. The wrapper appearance has stood strong, dark, and very oily. The high nicotine content is still present. The cigar begins to get hot and bitter with about an inch left of the smoke. Total smoke time 2 hours and 10 minutes. I would recommend this cigar after a full meal and to anyone that wants a bold smoke with tons of flavor.

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

Created by legendary cigar blenders Manuel Quesada and Nestor Plasencia, this Nicaraguan puro sports a reddish Colorado maduro wrapper that has a nice oily finish to it. Medium to full body but very smooth to smoke and easy to retro-hale with flavors of cedar, coffee, cream and black pepper. Burns incredibly stable requiring no touch ups and has a nice sturdy light gray ash. If you are looking for the perfect concoction of complex rich flavors, a Nicaraguan puro that won't have you reaching for a glass of milk, this is a silky smooth, full flavored smoke with perfect construction that would make a worthy addition to your humidor.
