This week, I decided to review the Aladino Sumatra Toro. This toro cigar is a limited edition featuring a Sumatra-seed wrapper. This wrapper varietal promises earthy, somewhat spicy flavors and a sweet aftertaste. The dry draw had clear notes of wood and leather. The first third is sweet with a slight spice and woody, almost caramel-like flavors. It's a promising cigar with a good consistency to the smoke. Into the second and third, the spice dies down and is replaced with more of that honey-sweet. Additionally, an earthy and woody aroma comes through, along with a prominent aftertaste of coffee. The cigar was a pleasant experience, with Aladino's consistently excellent construction and a solid ash buildup. I would describe its profile as medium to medium full. And because of the earthy notes and lingering aftertaste, I think something to cut through that would be ideal. For me, that would be a Scotch on the rocks.

Tasting Notes: Bold cigar with leathery and cedar notes. **Appearance:** The look of the cigar is a dark brown with a slight oily finish. **First Third:** Straight from the light I get hints of cedar and earthy tobacco. The draw is excellent but not a thick flow of smoke. The cigar hits the medium mark I'd say. **Second third:** About 20 minutes in I'm getting the same cedar and leather notes with a slight hint of pepper. **Burn** is still perfect and has not had to be re-lit once yet. **Last Third:** Going into the last third of the cigar. The smoke production has gone from light smoke to heavy smoke. It's kept its consistency through the smoke not a super complex cigar. It has kept the same tasting notes the entire time. Overall, a great smoke. I would recommend it to anyone that wants a consistent and good smoke.

This cigar is more of a mild to medium cigar, great in the morning with a cup of coffee.

I would like to start this one by saying the brand Warped as a whole is phenomenal! Without further ado I give to you the La Hacienda Gran Robusto. This wonderful stick gave me a pleasant experience from start to finish. Before even cutting and lighting, I was already getting a very nice aroma of cedar, and after cutting I took a dry draw that met me with notes of spice & dried fruit. Upon lighting, I could tell I was in for a good one with how nice and open the draw was! As I smoked the first half of this stick I experienced spice, toast, a light cedar, and some notes of graham cracker. As I shifted into the second half it retained some of the spice but transitioned into more noticeable notes of earth, dried fruit and some floral notes. You need to try one of these if you haven't already! I smoked this one down to the nub so that should tell you something. I definitely recommend having this stick inside your humidor at all times.

This full-bodied toro from Hoyo de Monterrey drew me in as soon as I saw it. A dark, oily Connecticut Broadleaf wrapper contrasted by a gold label; the Dark Knight I looks as good as it tastes. The dry draw gives sweet notes of chocolate that serve as a delicious precursor for what's to come. Upon lighting you're greeted by a chocolate taste and a fragrant spice from the Broadleaf wrapper and Nicaraguan fillers. Draw is a little open, but this stick produces plenty of smoke. In the second third, the spice gives way to an earthy funkiness typical of Honduran tobacco. Faint notes of black pepper spice linger on. By the final third that sweet earth taste takes over. The black pepper provides some nice complexity without overpowering the sweet maduro taste. The Dark Knight I provides smooth maduro complexity and stiff strength levels. A good draw and a burn that only needed to be corrected a few times are signs of good construction.
