As I pick up the CAO Gold torpedo I feel lots of black pepper and dark-roast coffee notes. Mellow spices and hints of dark chocolate and leather enter. Notes of cedar and butterscotch characterize the retro-hale. After about an inch, the flavors become somewhat salty and citrusy, but still mild to the touch. The second half is nicely balanced. The retro-hale is spicy while an overall creaminess unfolds. The long, lingering finish is a perfect balance of citrus and leather with notes of charred oak but the creaminess from the Ecuadorian Connecticut wrapper keeps it really intriguing. And also this cigar would be a perfect pair with a cup of whiskey.

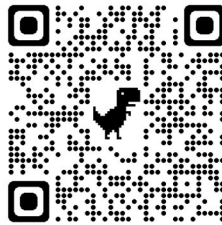

Man, do I have a great one for all you "small commitment" smokers! I give you the Saga Short Tales TOMO IV. I really found this size to be quite perfect for convenience purposes, and it may even seem a bit familiar, being a similar vitola to another Dominican cigar with "short" in its name. I myself am not the type to commit to longer smokes so this one quickly found a home in my humidor. After smoking this shorty for the first time, I experienced a lot of interesting notes throughout. Beginning with subtle floral & cedar notes, it balanced out with some dried fruit notes and a touch of spice, leaving a pleasant overall taste. Upon entering the second half, the complexity deepened. From that florally fruit profile we transitioned to a more tobacco-forward profile with notes of cocoa. It carried these flavors throughout the cigar, and it had a great draw and construction the entire time. This cigar is definitely one for the "books"!

**PAIRING SUGGESTION:** Coffee, IPA Beer, or Port Wine

To celebrate three-decades of crafting excellent premium cigars, Nick Perdomo released the aptly named Perdomo 30th Anniversary Maduro cigar. To drive home the anniversary angle, Perdomo used a Nicaraguan Cuban-seed maduro wrapper that was barrel aged for 15 years. Then he wrapped it around a binder and filler composed of premium Nicaraguan tobacco that was also aged for 15 years:  $15 + 15 = 30$ . Get it? I was expecting this all-Nicaraguan smoke to pack a spicy punch, but because its leaves were aged, the overall flavor profile was smooth, creamy, and sweet. It did have hints of oak and spice, but for the most part this toro was all sweetness. The ash was white and did not want to fall off the cigar. If you're looking for a special occasion smoke at an affordable price, I recommend this cigar. Even if the occasion is to watch the sun set, which is pretty special. Pair it with an espresso (no sugar) to contrast the cigar's sweetness.

**PAIRING SUGGESTION:** Espresso coffee, no sugar

The Villiger Cuellar Connecticut Kreme Torpedo is gorgeous. The elegant white band draped over the silky smooth Ecuadorian Connecticut wrapper makes for an inviting presentation. Upon lighting you're greeted with a wave of nutty, creamy aromas. The torpedo has an excellent draw and produces lots of smoke. Notes of cashews and hay envelop the pallet in the first third. I detected a subtle aroma of spicy cedar in the retro-hale, which complemented the cigar. Moving on to the second third, the spice fades while that nutty sweetness lingers. The burn needed correcting a few times. However, no drastic corrections were required, owing to its good construction. Warm flavors of baked bread and honey are present, and its spice tickles the nose. The Kreme started and ended strong with the same sweet and nutty flavors. A smooth finish of café con leche lingers on the pallet after finishing. This creamy Dominican makes for a great morning cigar.

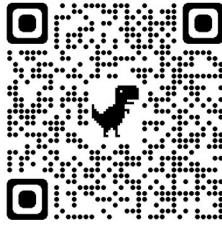

Its smooth Cameroon wrapper telegraphed its creamy and tobacco sweetness profile. The draw was effortless and the ash was salt and peppery. The flavor profile was consistent throughout with spikes of spice along the way which made things interesting. The construction was solid with some give. Strength-wise, the Mistico was mild to medium, which makes it a good morning or afternoon smoke.

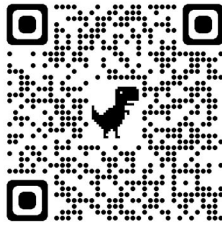
